Sky Mobile Customers Can Now Stream TV Without **Using Data**

It might not be one of the 'big four' networks in the UK, but Sky Mobile customers are probably feeling quite smug about their choice now. The network has just upgraded its Sky Watch offer, now a major perk whereby you can stream TV, film and sports on your mobile connection without using any of your data.

The deal includes all Sky apps (Sky Go, Sky Kids, Sky Sports and Sky Cinema) and all Sky Mobile customers are automatically included as long as they've got 50MB of data allowance (which is bugger all, so if you've got less than that, have a word with yourself).

There are no data caps on Sky Watch (though we wouldn't be surprised if there's a fair use thing) and you can even use it in the EU without using up data. Considering how much checking your email costs on holiday on some contracts, that's a pretty sweet deal.

For comparison, here's how much data you'd be using otherwise:

New Sky Mobile Watch: unlimited streaming without using your mobile data

Watch what you want without eating into your mobile data









Sky has announced a new version of its Sky Mobile Watch feature, which now gives Sky Mobile customers unlimited streaming of content on any Sky app (including Sky Go, Sky Kids, Sky Sports and Sky Cinema) without eating into any of their mobile data allowance.

Sky customers can stream anything that comes under their subscription through the Sky mobile apps in the UK and the EU. Previously, Watch only allowed Sky users to download shows to a smartphone or tablet to watch offline.

Sky customers without a TV package subscription can still benefit, with them able to stream Sky content that doesn't require a subscription, such as Sky News.

Sky says an hour-long episode of Game of Thrones equates to 1.4GB, which would typically cost just under £15 in data (based on the figures by Future Digital Media that 1GB of data is valued at £9.27).

So essentially, avid smartphone streamers of Sky content who normally rack up data usage outside of their allowance should now save a lot of money.
